Guide to the City Commission Proceedings

The Written Communication portion of the agenda is for members of the public to submit email correspondence to Recording Secretary at PublicSafety@malibucity.org before the meeting begins.

The Oral Communication portion of the agenda is for members of the public to present items which are not listed on the agenda, but are under the subject matter jurisdiction of the Commission. Although no action may be taken, the Commission and staff will follow up, at an appropriate time, on those items needing response. Each speaker is limited to (3) three minutes. Time may be surrendered by deferring one (1) minute to another in-person speaker, not to exceed a total of eight (8) minutes. The speaker wishing to defer time must be present when the item is heard and their form must be submitted with the speaker form for the

individual they are deferring time to. In order to be recognized and present an item, each speaker must complete and submit to the Recording Secretary a Request to Speak form *prior* to the beginning of the item being announced by the Chair (forms are available at the entrance to the meeting room). Speakers are taken in the order slips are submitted or hands are raised.

Items in Consent Calendar Section A have already been considered by the Commission at a previous meeting where the public was invited to comment, after which a decision was made. These items are not subject to public discussion at this meeting because the vote taken at the previous meeting was final. Resolutions concerning decisions made at previous meetings are for the purpose of memorializing the decision to assure the accuracy of the findings, the prior vote, and any conditions imposed.

Items in Consent Calendar Section B have not been discussed previously by the Commission. If discussion is desired, an item may be removed from the Consent Calendar for individual consideration. Commissioners may indicate a negative or abstaining vote on any individual item by so declaring prior to the vote on the motion to adopt the entire Consent Calendar. Items excluded from the Consent Calendar will be taken up by the Commission following the action on the Consent Calendar. The Commission first will take up the items for which public speaker requests have been submitted. Public speakers shall follow the rules as set forth under Oral Communication.

Items in Old Business are items which have appeared on previous agendas but have either been continued or tabled to this meeting with no final action having been taken. Public comment shall follow the rules as set forth under Oral Communication.

Items in New Business are items which are appearing for the first time for formal action. Public comment shall follow the rules as set forth under Oral Communication.

The Role of the Presiding Officer of the Commission, who shall be the Chair, shall be responsible for maintaining the order and decorum of meetings. It shall be the duty of the presiding officer to ensure that these rules of procedure and decorum are followed at all times. The presiding officer shall maintain control of communication between Commissioners, between the Commission and the public, and chair each meeting in a fair and impartial manner. It shall be the duty of each Commissioner to support the presiding officer in maintaining the order and decorum of Commission meetings.



Subject: Review Schedule of Parking Citation Penalties

RECOMMENDED ACTION: 1) Review the Schedule of Parking Citation Penalties; and 2) Consider recommended increases to certain violations; and 3) Provide a recommendation to the City Council, if appropriate.

DISCUSSION: At the November 3, 2021 Public Safety Commission Regular Meeting, the Public Safety Commission (Commission) conducted a review of the City's Schedule of Parking Citation Penalties and was presented with parking violations to consider for increased fines. The list of proposed increases was based on input from the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (LASD) Lost Hills Station and Volunteers on Patrol (VOP), which highlighted violations that are most frequently written, pose public safety hazards, and did not appear to have fines that sufficiently deter the behavior. The following fine increases were proposed and ultimately adopted by the City Council in April 2022:

Since 2022, a number of new safety enhancements have been implemented or are in the process of being implemented, such as the installation of Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) cameras throughout the City and the upcoming speed camera program along PCH. Therefore, it is recommended that the Commission conduct another review of the Schedule of Parking Citation Penalties to determine if updates are warranted to increase deterrence of violations that pose serious public safety hazards or to support the new public safety enhancements.

To support the effectiveness of the ALPR and speed cameras, staff recommends that the Commission consider increasing the fines for violations pertaining to license plates. These violations are typically “fix-it” tickets, which allow for the citation amount to be significantly reduced upon submitting proof of correction. However, currently, only about 5% of people who receive these types of violations make corrections. An increase in the fines may serve to better motivate people to make the necessary corrections and ensure compliance with the California Vehicle Code. The table below illustrates the recommended increases:

Attached for the Commission's review is the current Schedule of Parking Penalties along with a Parking Fine Comparison Chart that compares the City's current and proposed citation fine schedule to that of other neighboring cities, including Newport Beach, Santa Monica, and Beverly Hills among others. It is important to keep in mind the court ruling *Pimentel vs. City of Los Angeles* (2020) which argued that parking tickets and fees must comply with the U.S. Constitution Eighth Amendment's ban on "excessive fines."



Subject: Homeless Services Monthly Report

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Discuss recent homeless services activities and receive and file the monthly reports for January 2026 from The People Concern.

DISCUSSION: Since 2017, the City of Malibu has provided homeless outreach services through a contract with The People Concern (TPC). TPC provides a three-person Outreach Team that engages people and families experiencing homelessness on the streets, hillsides, and beaches of Malibu. The team provides housing navigation services and individualized support to help them attain housing and become self-sufficient. The monthly report summarizing their services for the month of January 2026 are attached.

January 2026 Report

Outcomes

In January 2026, the total number of contacts made by the outreach team was 187, with 54 unduplicated contacts 3 individuals were contacted in permanent or temporary housing. Of the 51 unduplicated contacts currently on the streets, 5 were new contacts, with 1 of them becoming a repeat contact. There are currently 26 contacts considered in various stages of engagement, and 25 are refusing services at this point. The outreach team continues to contact these individuals with the goal of getting them engaged in the housing process.

Success Story

In January 2026, The People Concern's Malibu Outreach Team successfully supported LILY, an elderly woman experiencing homelessness in Malibu, through persistent engagement, trust-building, and client-centered care that ultimately led to her placement in interim housing.

LILY was referred to the Malibu Outreach Team by the City of Malibu Public Safety Liaison, who contacted the team regarding concerns for an elderly woman living unhoused in the area. The liaison provided LILY's contact information, allowing the team to begin outreach efforts. After making initial contact, the team coordinated a meeting with LILY at the Malibu Lunch service provided by the CART program, where she felt safe and comfortable engaging in conversation.

During this first meeting, LILY shared her story. She explained that she was originally from the East Coast and had come to California seeking new opportunities. Unfortunately, after losing her housing, she found herself without a stable place to stay and was temporarily living in a friend's vehicle in Malibu. LILY expressed a clear desire for permanent housing but was firmly opposed to interim housing, citing her anxiety disorder and fear that a congregate setting would exacerbate her symptoms and potentially trigger panic attacks.

Due to extreme weather conditions and ongoing medical concerns, the Malibu Outreach Team arranged a temporary motel placement for LILY using emergency county funds. This placement provided her with immediate safety from the rainstorms and allowed her the space and time to decompress. While staying at the motel, LILY was able to gather her belongings, stabilize emotionally, and begin thinking more clearly about her future housing options.

As the motel stay approached its end, the outreach team re-engaged LILY in conversations about housing, acknowledging her mental health challenges and validating her concerns. The team discussed available interim housing options and emphasized the accommodations and ongoing support that would be provided to help her feel safe and successful. After careful consideration, LILY made a courageous decision to take a leap of faith and accept an interim housing placement.

The Malibu Outreach Team assisted LILY every step of the way. They helped her transfer her belongings to a nearby storage facility due to limited space at the interim site, provided transportation, and supported her through the intake process to ensure a smooth transition. Throughout the process, the team offered reassurance, encouragement, and consistent emotional support.

Today, LILY is safely housed indoors, where she's able to recollect herself, reorient, and begin organizing her life after a prolonged period of instability. She remains motivated and holds strong aspirations for independence and eventually securing her own private, permanent housing. On-site case management is actively working with LILY to pursue permanent housing options, ensuring she remains housed, healthy, and safe.

This success reflects the Malibu Outreach Team's commitment to persistent engagement, empathy, and meeting clients where they are—demonstrating how trust, patience, and compassion can lead to meaningful and life-changing outcomes.

Next Steps:

Our team will continue its ongoing mission to support individuals currently experiencing homelessness in Malibu through consistent street outreach, engagement, and resource coordination. We will also maintain active collaboration with clients placed in Interim Housing (IH) beds funded by the City of Malibu to help ensure continued stability, address emerging needs, and prepare them for successful transitions into permanent housing placements. This process will allow for the timely turnover of IH beds, creating availability for newly identified clients in need of immediate shelter and supportive services.

Subject: Parking Enforcement Monthly Report

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Discuss recent parking enforcement activities and receive and file the monthly reports for January 2026 from the LAZ Parking Enforcement Team.

DISCUSSION: On July 3, 2024, the LAZ Parking Enforcement Team began operations to provide additional support to the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department and Volunteers on Patrol. Since the start of their operations, the LAZ Parking Enforcement Team has issued citations for a variety of violations, including obstruction of roadways, obeying parking signs, blocking fire hydrants, oversized vehicle ordinance, unauthorized handicap parking, and more.

The LAZ Parking Enforcement Team provides monthly reports that summarize their monthly citation counts and provides an overview of the most common parking violations. The reports provide a quantifiable metric to measure enforcement activity and areas of focus. The monthly report summarizing their services for the month of January 2026 is attached.




