Los Angeles Countywide Curfew in Effect in Malibu Wednesday, June 3, 9:00 PM through Thursday, June 4, 5:00 AM

(Malibu, CA) – Los Angeles County, including the City of Malibu, will be under a countywide curfew to protect public safety from 9:00 PM today, Wednesday, June 3, 2020, through 5:00 AM on Thursday, June 4, 2020. Please note that tonight's countywide curfew starts later and ends earlier than the previous nights, based on the County's assessment of changing public safety needs.

Individual cities in LA County can implement stricter curfews, so Malibu community members may receive alerts from other cities stating earlier curfew start times. The countywide curfew in effect in Malibu is 9:00 PM to 5:00 AM.

The Sheriff's Department is enforcing the curfew across the County and in Malibu. During the curfew hours, it is a misdemeanor for any person to be on a public street, place, walkway, alley, park or other public area, with the following exceptions: peace officers; firefighters; National Guard or other military personnel deployed to the area; emergency medical services personnel; individuals traveling to and from work; individuals working on a public work of improvement construction project; credentialed media representatives involved in news gathering; people experiencing homelessness and without access to a viable shelter; and individuals seeking medical treatment.

No civil unrest incidents have been reported in Malibu.

The City and Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department will not tolerate looting or violence and the City is in close coordination with the Sheriff's Department and LA County Supervisor Sheila Kuehl's office on any potential response in Malibu.

The City of Malibu supports peaceful First Amendment protest and offers our support to our neighboring cities that have been hard hit with looting and violence.

The City Council and staff are here to serve the community and are committed to protecting the health and safety of the Malibu community during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and the current civil unrest. The City Emergency Operations Center (EOC) remains activated, the City continues to monitor the situation together with the Sheriff's Department and will put out emergency alerts and public safety information as needed.

Although many restrictions of the County and State Stay-at-Home Orders have been eased, the Orders remain in effect to slow the spread of the coronavirus, including physical distancing and wearing cloth face coverings when people are not in their residence. Malibu residents are urged to comply with the curfew and to stay safe at home, and to call 911 to report any emergency.
