General Plan Housing Element and Safety and Health Element Updates

Release Date: June 19, 2020 Submissions
Due: 4:00 pm on July 20, 2020

1. Introduction

The City of Malibu is seeking proposals from qualified firms for contract planning services to prepare the Housing Element update for submission to the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) as well as the Safety and Health Element update, in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations and statutes. The Consultant shall also be responsible for undertaking all steps necessary to prepare and process the Housing Element Update in conformance with HCD guidelines, requirements and timelines. This project would build on the efforts of the City's consultant over the last year pertaining to its Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) for the 6th planning cycle.

1.1 Background

The City of Malibu (City) is a coastal city located in the northwestern portion of Los Angeles County, California, with a population of approximately 13,000. The City was incorporated in 1991, operates under the Council/Manager form of government, and is considered a contract city. The five members of the City Council are elected at-large. They serve staggered four-year terms, with the Mayor being selected from among the Council Members.

The City covers approximately 21 miles along the coast and offers a full range of municipal services. The City has 81 full-time employees and 15 full-time equivalent part-time employees. The City's seven departments provide a number of in-house services including management and administrative services, building safety, community services, environmental sustainability, planning, public works and engineering. Police and fire services are provided via contract with Los Angeles County. Other services such as the City Attorney, water, street maintenance and garbage collection services are also provided via contract or by Los Angeles County. The City of Malibu's Adopted Fiscal Year 2019-2020 General Fund Operating Budget is \$31.02 million and the City's Overall Operating Budget is \$48 million.

The Planning Department assists the community in planning for the future and managing development consistent with the community vision, while meeting City regulatory obligations. Staff provides a wide range of professional advice and services to the public, applicants, outside agencies, the Planning Commission and the City Council. The Planning Department provides current and long range planning, biological services and code enforcement, as well as a robust public information and records management program.

The City's General Plan was initially adopted in 1995 and the Housing Element has been amended three times, in 1997, 2001, 2008, and 2014. The Safety and Health Element has not been updated since the adoption of the City's General Plan.

A comprehensive update of the Housing Element for the 6th planning cycle is now required. In addition, State law requires that the Safety and Health Element be updated concurrently with each Housing Element update. The updated Housing Element, Safety and Health Element, and related California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) documentation for the 6th planning cycle must be approved by the City Council and, if necessary, certified by the California Coastal Commission. The Housing Element must be certified by HCD Certification Letter from HCD by October 2021.

Scope of Services

The City desires that the Housing Element and Safety and Health Element updates should be developed through a consensus building process that is fully responsive to comments and concerns of the public and affected/interested agencies. The range of work under proposals submitted shall include the necessary efforts of research, and to prepare and present all materials necessary to affect the submission of an updated Housing Element and Safety and Health Element that are acceptable to the Malibu City Council and a Housing Element that will be certified by HCD. This is envisioned as, but is not limited to, the items listed in the "Proposal Content" section below.

Project Components

A. Housing Element

Prior to initiating work on the Housing Element, the Consultant shall carefully review the City's existing housing-related documents to develop a focused list of data needs. The Consultant shall meet with City staff to collect available data, and pursue outside data as necessary. The Consultant's work shall include updates of the following sections of the Housing Element:

1. ***Introduction***

The introductory chapter to the Housing Element sets the stage by describing the purpose of the Housing Element in lay terms and establishes the community’s housing context. The Introduction also typically includes a summary of key housing issues; establishes the Housing Element’s relationship with the balance of the General Plan; and describes the public participation process.

2. ***Housing Needs Assessment***

Malibu’s current Housing Element is primarily based on the 2010 U.S. Census; therefore, the Housing Needs Assessment will require a comprehensive update using 2020 Census data as that becomes available, and other current market information. Updated information shall be provided pertaining to 1) population and household characteristics; 2) housing stock characteristics; 3) assisted housing at-risk of conversion to market rate; and 4) the Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) for the City as adopted by the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG).

3. ***Potential Housing Constraints and Resources***

The Consultant shall prepare an updated analysis of potential constraints upon the maintenance, improvement or development of housing in Malibu to include market conditions (construction costs, land costs, availability of financing) and an additional public policy discussion of zoning, residential development standards, codes and enforcement, on- and off-site improvements, fees and taxes, and processing and permit procedures. This section shall also include a discussion of incentives offered by the City for provision of affordable housing, such as the density bonus program, modified development standards, fee reductions, etc. The resources analysis shall evaluate financial resources available for program implementation, including Federal, State, local and private funding sources. In addition, this section shall include a summary of administrative resources available to assist in achieving the City’s housing goals.

4. ***Review of Existing Housing Element***

In order to develop appropriate programs to address the housing needs identified in the prior tasks, the Consultant shall work with City staff to determine the achievements under adopted housing programs in the existing Housing Element, and evaluate the effectiveness of these programs in delivering housing services. This evaluation shall include a description of the City’s track record in producing new affordable housing during the planning period, and a comparison of housing production with the City’s identified regional housing growth needs.

Deliverable: Memo identifying recommended changes to the current Housing Element

5. ***Draft Housing Element***

Based on the evaluation conducted in the prior phases, combined with input from HCD, City decision-makers, and the public, the Housing Element will be updated. To implement changes to the document, the Consultant shall develop and submit to City staff a redline version (track changes) of the Administrative Draft Housing Element to delineate all proposed revisions. For any new programs proposed, a summary chart shall be prepared which specifies the following for each program: program objective, funding source, responsible agency and implementation time frame. This chart will be used to track program implementation, and can serve as the basis for the City's annual report to HCD. Based on direction received from City staff, the Consultant shall make any appropriate revisions to the Draft Housing Element, and provide a version to City staff for final review prior to finalizing the Draft Housing Element for public review and submittal to HCD.

6. ***Environmental Documentation***

It is anticipated that the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) certified for the 2008-2014 Housing Element Update will be utilized as a starting point for the environmental review for the 6th Planning Cycle Housing Element and Safety and Health Element, with an initial study/mitigated negative declaration or other review to be prepared as needed.

Deliverable: Initial Study / Negative Declaration

7. ***Public Review and Finalization***

Upon receipt of comments from HCD on the Public Review Draft Housing Element, the Consultant shall draft a memo identifying any recommended changes to the Housing Element necessary to achieve HCD compliance. The Consultant shall assist City staff in conducting the Planning Commission and City Council public hearings on the Draft Housing Element. All comments and changes arising from these meetings will be prepared for incorporation into the final documents.

B. Safety and Health Element

Prior to initiating work on the Safety and Health Element, the Consultant shall carefully review the City's existing safety and health-related documents to develop a focused list of data needs. The Consultant shall meet with City staff to collect available data, and pursue outside data as necessary. The Consultant's work shall include updates of the following sections of the Safety and Health Element:

1. ***Introduction***

The introductory chapter to the Safety and Health Element sets the stage by describing the legal requirements and purpose of the Safety and Health Element in lay terms. The Introduction also typically establishes the community's safety and health context and includes a summary of key public safety issues.

2. ***Existing Conditions***

Updated information shall be provided pertaining to the physical risks posed to the City of Malibu as well as other relevant threats to public health.

This section of the Safety and Health Element should utilize the data and findings included in existing and ongoing reports, strategic plans, and initiatives taken by the City.

3. ***Goals, Objectives, Policies, and Implementation Measures***

In order to develop appropriate policies and implementation measures to address the risks and vulnerabilities discussed in the prior section, the Consultant shall work with City staff to determine the achievements and recommendations already made by the relevant existing and ongoing reports, strategic plans, and initiatives taken by the City such as the Community Wildfire Protection Plan, Coastal Vulnerability Assessment, and others. This analysis shall also evaluate financial resources available for policy and program implementation, including Federal, State, local and private funding sources. In addition, this section shall include a summary of administrative resources available to assist in achieving the City's safety and health goals.

Deliverable: Memo identifying recommended changes to the current Safety and Health Element

6. ***Draft Safety and Health Element***

Based on the evaluation conducted in the prior phases, combined with input from the Los Angeles County Fire Department, CalFire, City decision-makers, and the public, the Safety and Health Element will be updated. To implement changes to the document, the Consultant shall develop and submit to City staff a redline version (track changes) of the

Administrative Draft Safety and Health Element to delineate all proposed revisions. Based on direction received from City staff, the Consultant shall make any appropriate revisions to the Draft Safety and Health Element, and provide a version to City staff for final review prior to finalizing the Draft Safety and Health Element for public review.

8. *Public Review and Finalization*

Upon receipt of comments from the public, including public agencies, Planning Commission and City Council on the Public Review Draft Safety and Health Element, the Consultant shall draft a memo identifying any recommended changes to the Safety and Health Element. The Consultant shall assist City staff in conducting the Planning Commission and City Council public hearings on the Draft Safety and Health Element. All comments and changes arising from these meetings will be prepared for incorporation into the final documents.

Deliverables: Final Safety and Health Element based on City Council Direction

2. Instructions

2.1 Proposal Requirements

Proposals should not include any materials to be returned to the consultant and should be a concise statement. Each proposal must include the following information:

1. Organization, Credentials and Experience

- a. Provide a summary of the company's qualifications, credentials and related past experience.
- b. Describe the size of your company; indicate the principal, as well as all other personnel who will be assigned to the work.
- c. Provide a list of three of the company's similar clients including the names, titles, addresses, and telephone numbers of the appropriate persons which the City can contact.

2. Understanding of the Scope of Work

- a. Provide a narrative of the company's understanding of the Scope of Work and a proposal to perform the work.

3. Professional Services Agreement

- a. The selected provider must use and comply with the terms and conditions of the City's standard Professional Services Agreement as provided in Attachment 1 of this RFP.

4. Compliance

- a. A written statement that the Consultant shall comply with the California Labor Code, pursuant to said regulations entitled: Federal Labor Standards provisions; Federal Prevailing Wage Decision; and State of California Prevailing Wage Rates, respectively.

5. Litigation

- a. Firms are required to list past, current, or pending litigation resulting from professional services rendered over the past five years. If a court or an arbitrator rendered a decision, state the results.

6. Fees

- a. **Under Separate Cover**, provide an hourly rate proposal for all personnel.

7. Timeline

- a. The City intends to award a professional service agreement for a base term of two years.

2.2 Submittal Procedure

Clarifications: The City will respond to requests for clarification to the Request for Proposals in written RFP Addendum(s) as needed. Inquiries should be directed by email only to bblue@malibucity.org. No verbal requests will be accepted. All requests for clarification must be received by Friday, July 8, 2020.

Response Preparations: No reimbursement will be made by the City for costs incurred in the preparation of the response to this Request for Proposals. Submitted materials will not be returned and become the property of the City of Malibu.

Right to Reject Submittals: Submission of proposals indicates acceptance by the firm of the conditions contained in this request for proposals unless clearly and specifically noted in the submittal and confirmed in the agreement between the City of Malibu and the firm selected. The City of Malibu reserves the right without prejudice to reject any or all submittals.

STANDARD AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

This Agreement is made and entered into as of [date] by and between the City of Malibu (hereinafter referred to as the "City"), and _____ (hereinafter referred to as "Consultant").

The City and the Consultant agree as follows:

RECITALS

A. The City does not have the personnel able and/or available to perform the services required under this Agreement.

B. The City desires to contract out for consulting services for certain projects relating
_____.

C. The Consultant warrants to the City that it has the qualifications, experience and facilities to perform properly and timely the services under this Agreement.

D. The City desires to contract with the Consultant to perform the services as described in Exhibit A of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City and the Consultant agree as follows:

1.0 SCOPE OF THE CONSULTANT'S SERVICES. The Consultant agrees to provide the services and perform the tasks set forth in the Scope of Work, attached to and made part of this Agreement, except that, to the extent that any provision in Exhibit A conflicts with this Agreement, the provisions of this Agreement govern. The Scope of Work may be amended from time to time by way of a written directive from the City.

2.0 TERM OF AGREEMENT. This Agreement will become effective on [date], and will remain in effect for a period of ____ years from said date unless otherwise expressly extended and agreed to by both parties or terminated by either party as provided herein.

3.0 CITY AGENT. The City Manager, or her designee, for the purposes of this Agreement, is the agent for the City; whenever approval or authorization is required, Consultant understands that the City Manager, or her designee, has the authority to provide that approval or authorization.

4.0 COMPENSATION FOR SERVICES. The City shall pay the Consultant for its professional services rendered and costs incurred pursuant to this Agreement in accordance with the Scope of Work's fee and cost schedule. The cost of services shall be \$ _____ per month, for a total amount not to exceed \$ _____. No additional compensation shall be paid for any other expenses incurred, unless first approved by the City Manager, or her designee.

4.1 The Consultant shall submit to the City, by no later than the 10th day of each month, its bill for services itemizing the fees and costs incurred during the previous month. The City shall pay the Consultant all uncontested amounts set forth in the Consultant's bill within 30 days after it is received.

5.0 CONFLICT OF INTEREST. The Consultant represents that it presently has no interest and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, in any real property located in the City which may be affected by the services to be performed by the Consultant under this Agreement. The Consultant further represents that in performance of this Agreement, no person having any such interest shall be employed by it.

5.1 The Consultant represents that no City employee or official has a material financial interest in the Consultant's business. During the term of this Agreement and/or as a result of being awarded this contract, the Consultant shall not offer, encourage or accept any financial interest in the Consultant's business by any City employee or official.

5.2 If a portion of the Consultant's services called for under this Agreement shall ultimately be paid for by reimbursement from and through an agreement with a developer of any land within the City or with a City franchisee, the Consultant warrants that it has not performed any work for such developer/franchisee within the last 12 months, and shall not negotiate, offer or accept any contract or request to perform services for that identified developer/franchisee during the term of this Agreement.

6.0 GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS.

6.1 Termination. Either the City Manager or the Consultant may terminate this Agreement, without cause, by giving the other party ten (10) days written notice of such termination and the effective date thereof.

6.1.1 In the event of such termination, all finished or unfinished documents, reports, photographs, films, charts, data, studies, surveys, drawings, models, maps, or other documentation prepared by or in the possession of the Consultant under this Agreement shall be returned to the City. If the City terminates this Agreement without cause, the Consultant shall prepare and shall be entitled to receive compensation pursuant to a close-out bill for services rendered and fees incurred pursuant to this Agreement through the notice of termination. If the Consultant terminates this Agreement without cause, the Consultant shall be paid only for those services completed in a manner satisfactory to the City.

6.1.2 If the Consultant or the City fail to fulfill in a timely and proper manner its obligations under this Agreement, or if the Consultant or the City violate any of the covenants, agreements, or stipulations of this Agreement, the Consultant or the City shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by giving written notice to the other party of such termination and specifying the effective date of such termination. The Consultant shall be entitled to receive compensation in accordance with the terms of this Agreement for any work satisfactorily completed hereunder. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Consultants shall not be relieved of liability for damage sustained by virtue of any breach of this Agreement and any payments due under this Agreement may be withheld to off-set anticipated damages.

6.2 Non-Assignability. The Consultant shall not assign or transfer any interest in this Agreement without the express prior written consent of the City.

6.3 Non-Discrimination. The Consultant shall not discriminate as to race, creed, gender, color, national origin or sexual orientation in the performance of its services and duties pursuant to this Agreement, and will comply with all applicable laws, ordinances and codes of the Federal, State, County and City governments.

6.4 Insurance. The Consultant shall submit to the City certificates indicating compliance with the following minimum insurance requirements no less than one (1) day prior to beginning of performance under this Agreement:

(a) Workers Compensation Insurance as required by law. The Consultant shall require all subcontractors similarly to provide such compensation insurance for their respective employees.

(b) Comprehensive general and automobile liability insurance protecting the Consultant in amounts not less than \$1,000,000 for personal injury to any one person, \$1,000,000 for injuries arising out of one occurrence, and \$500,000 for property damages or a combined single limit of \$1,000,000. Each such policy of insurance shall:

1) Be issued by a financially responsible insurance company or companies admitted and authorized to do business in the State of California or which is approved in writing by City.

2) Name and list as additional insured the City, its officers and employees.

3) Specify its acts as primary insurance.

4) Contain a clause substantially in the following words: "It is hereby understood and agreed that this policy shall not be canceled nor materially changed except upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the City of such cancellation or material change."

5) Cover the operations of the Consultant pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

6.5 Indemnification. Consultant shall indemnify, defend with counsel approved by City, and hold harmless City, its officers, officials, employees and volunteers from and against all liability, loss, damage, expense, cost (including without limitation reasonable attorneys fees, expert fees and all other costs and fees of litigation) of every nature arising out of or in connection with Consultant's performance of work hereunder or its failure to comply with any of its obligations contained in this Agreement, regardless of City's passive negligence, but excepting such loss or damage which is caused by the sole active negligence or willful misconduct of the City. Should City in its sole discretion find Consultant's legal counsel unacceptable, then Consultant shall reimburse the City its costs of defense, including without

limitation reasonable attorneys fees, expert fees and all other costs and fees of litigation. The Consultant shall promptly pay any final judgment rendered against the City (and its officers, officials, employees and volunteers) covered by this indemnity obligation. It is expressly understood and agreed that the foregoing provisions are intended to be as broad and inclusive as is permitted by the law of the State of California and will survive termination of this Agreement.

6.6 Compliance with Applicable Law. The Consultant and the City shall comply with all applicable laws, ordinances and codes of the federal, state, county and city governments, including, without limitation, Malibu Municipal Code Chapter 5.36 Minimum Wage.

6.7 Independent Contractor. This Agreement is by and between the City and the Consultant and is not intended, and shall not be construed, to create the relationship of agency, servant, employee, partnership, joint venture or association, as between the City and the Consultant.

6.7.1. The Consultant shall be an independent contractor, and shall have no power to incur any debt or obligation for or on behalf of the City. Neither the City nor any of its officers or employees shall have any control over the conduct of the Consultant, or any of the Consultant's employees, except as herein set forth, and the Consultant expressly warrants not to, at any time or in any manner, represent that it, or any of its agents, servants or employees are in any manner employees of the City, it being distinctly understood that the Consultant is and shall at all times remain to the City a wholly independent contractor and the Consultant's obligations to the City are solely such as are prescribed by this Agreement.

6.8 Copyright. No reports, maps or other documents produced in whole or in part under this Agreement shall be the subject of an application for copyright by or on behalf of the Consultant.

6.9 Legal Construction.

(a) This Agreement is made and entered into in the State of California and shall in all respects be interpreted, enforced and governed under the laws of the State of California.

(b) This Agreement shall be construed without regard to the identity of the persons who drafted its various provisions. Each and every provision of this Agreement shall be construed as though each of the parties participated equally in the drafting of same, and any rule of construction that a document is to be construed against the drafting party shall not be applicable to this Agreement.

(c) The article and section, captions and headings herein have been inserted for convenience only and shall not be considered or referred to in resolving questions of interpretation or construction.

(d) Whenever in this Agreement the context may so require, the masculine gender shall be deemed to refer to and include the feminine and neuter, and the singular shall refer to and include the plural.

6.10 Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts and as so executed shall constitute an agreement which shall be binding upon all parties hereto.

6.11 Final Payment Acceptance Constitutes Release. The acceptance by the Consultant of the final payment made under this Agreement shall operate as and be a release of the City from all claims and liabilities for compensation to the Consultant for anything done, furnished or relating to the Consultant's work or services. Acceptance of payment shall be any negotiation of the City's check or the failure to make a written extra compensation claim within ten (10) calendar days of the receipt of that check. However, approval or payment by the City shall not constitute, nor be deemed, a release of the responsibility and liability of the Consultant, its employees, sub-consultants and agents for the accuracy and competency of the information provided and/or work performed; nor shall such approval or payment be deemed to be an assumption of such responsibility or liability by the City for any defect or error in the work prepared by the Consultant, its employees, sub-consultants and agents.

6.12 Corrections. In addition to the above indemnification obligations, the Consultant shall correct, at its expense, all errors in the work which may be disclosed during the City's review of the Consultant's report or plans. Should the Consultant fail to make such correction in a reasonably timely manner, such correction shall be made by the City, and the cost thereof shall be charged to the Consultant.

6.13 Files. All files of the Consultant pertaining to the City shall be and remain the property of the City. The Consultant will control the physical location of such files during the term of this Agreement and shall be entitled to retain copies of such files upon termination of this Agreement.

6.14 Waiver; Remedies Cumulative. Failure by a party to insist upon the

performance of any of the provisions of this Agreement by the other party, irrespective of the length of time for which such failure continues, shall not constitute a waiver of such party's right to demand compliance by such other party in the future. No waiver by a party of a default or breach of the other party shall be effective or binding upon such party unless made in writing by such party, and no such waiver shall be implied from any omissions by a party to take any action with respect to such default or breach. No express written waiver of a specified default or breach shall affect any other default or breach, or cover any other period of time, other than any default or breach and/or period of time specified. All of the remedies permitted or available to a party under this Agreement, or at law or in equity, shall be cumulative and alternative, and invocation of any such right or remedy shall not constitute a waiver or election of remedies with respect to any other permitted or available right of remedy.

6.15 Mitigation of Damages. In all such situations arising out of this Agreement, the parties shall attempt to avoid and minimize the damages resulting from the conduct of the other party.

6.16 Partial Invalidity. If any provision in this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force without being impaired or invalidated in any way.

6.17 Attorneys' Fees. The parties hereto acknowledge and agree that each will bear his/her or its own costs, expenses and attorneys' fees arising out of and/or connected with the negotiation, drafting and execution of the Agreement, and all matters arising out of or connected therewith except that, in the event any action is brought by any party hereto to enforce this Agreement, the prevailing party in such action shall be entitled to reasonable attorneys' fees and costs in addition to all other relief to which that party or those parties may be entitled.

6.18 Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the whole agreement between the City and the Consultant, and neither party has made any representations to the other except as expressly contained herein. Neither party, in executing or performing this Agreement, is relying upon any statement or information not contained in this Agreement. Any changes or modifications to this Agreement must be made in writing appropriately executed by both the City and the Consultant.

6.19 Notices. Any notice required to be given hereunder shall be deemed to have been given by depositing said notice in the United States mail, postage prepaid, and addressed as follows:

6.20 Warranty of Authorized Signatories and Acceptance of Facimile or Electronic Signatures. Each of the signatories hereto warrants and represents that he or she is competent and authorized to enter into this Agreement on behalf of the party for whom he or she purports to sign. The Parties agree that this Contract, agreements ancillary to this Contract, and related documents to be entered into in connection with this Contract will be considered signed when the signature of a party is delivered by facsimile transmission or scanned and delivered via electronic mail. Such facsimile or electronic mail copies will be treated in all respects as having the same effect as an original signature.

7.0 GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS. (City and Consultant initials required at 7.1)

7.1 Disclosure Required.
