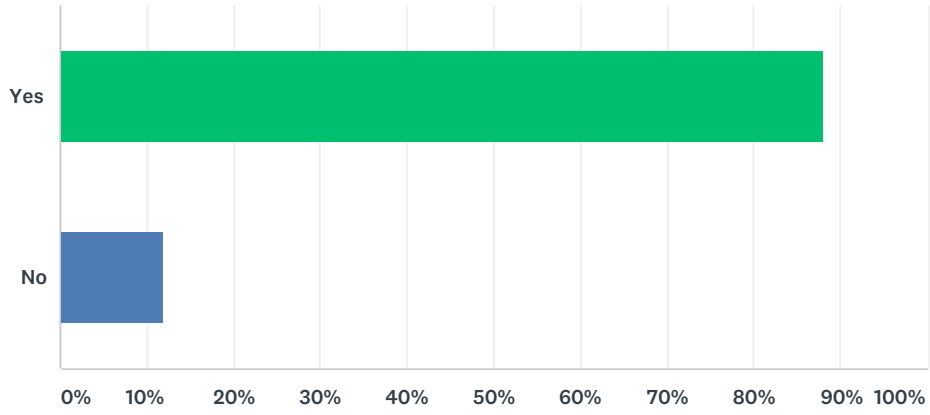


Q1 Do you live in Malibu?

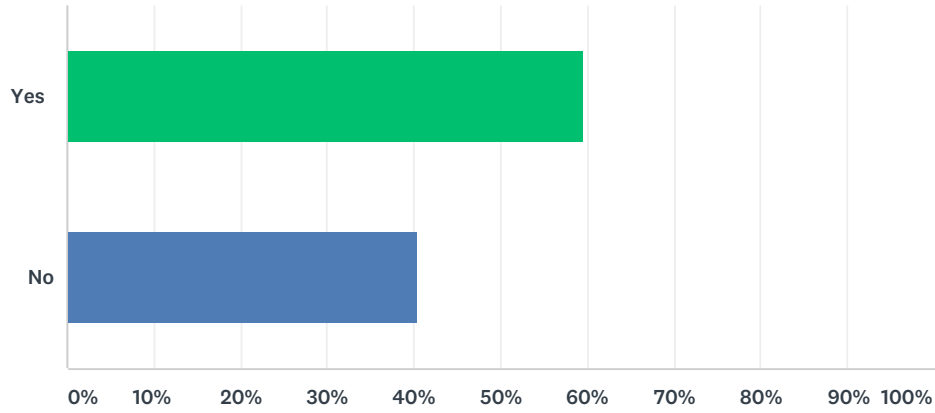

Q2 Do you work in Malibu?

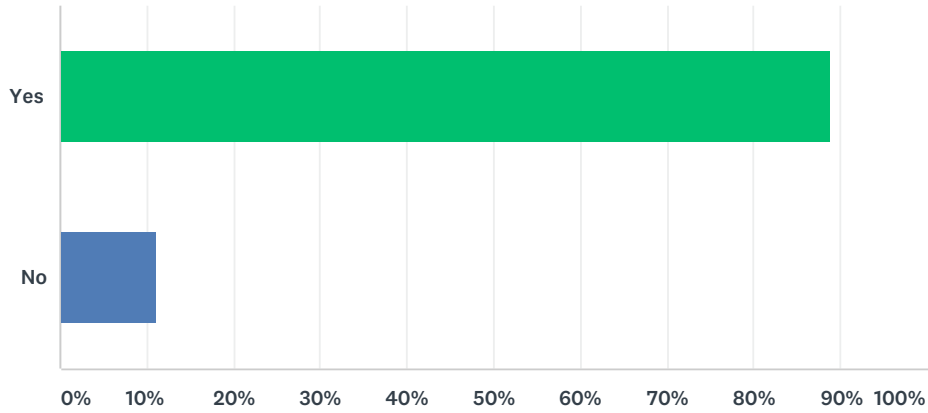

Q3 If you do not live or work in Malibu, are you a frequent visitor to Malibu? (Skip this question if you answered “yes” to either questions 1 or 2.)

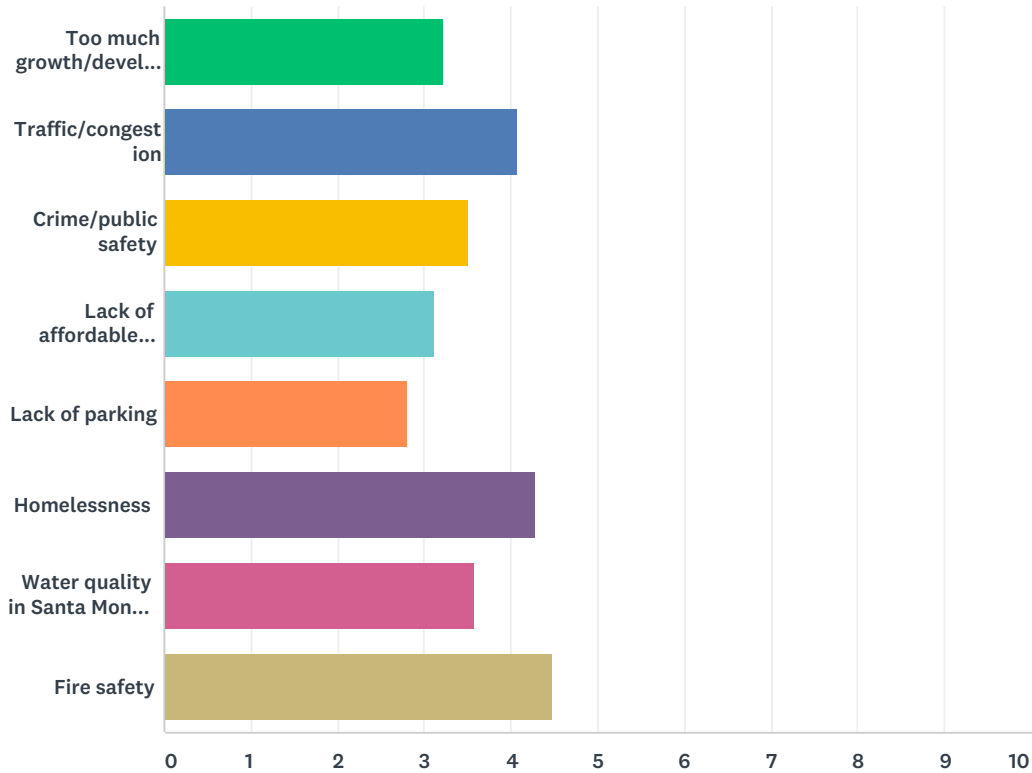

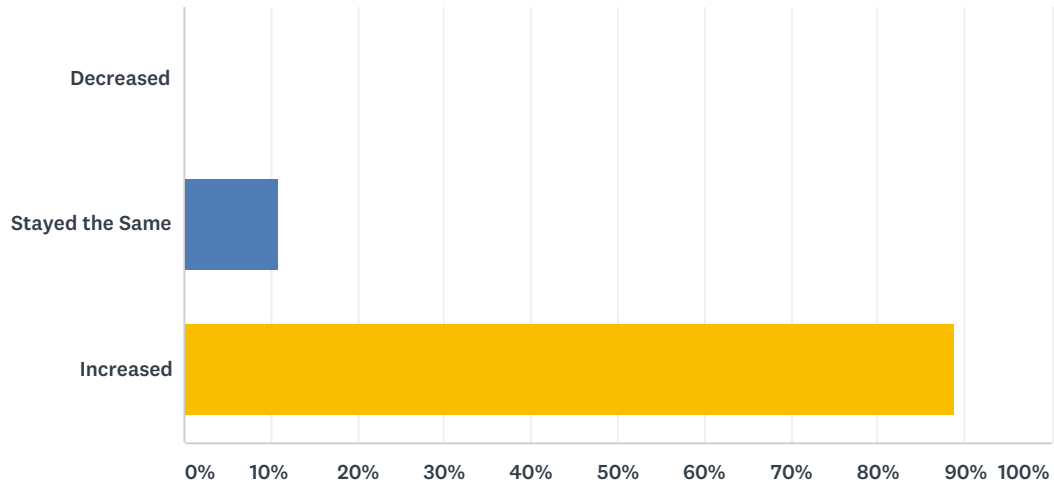

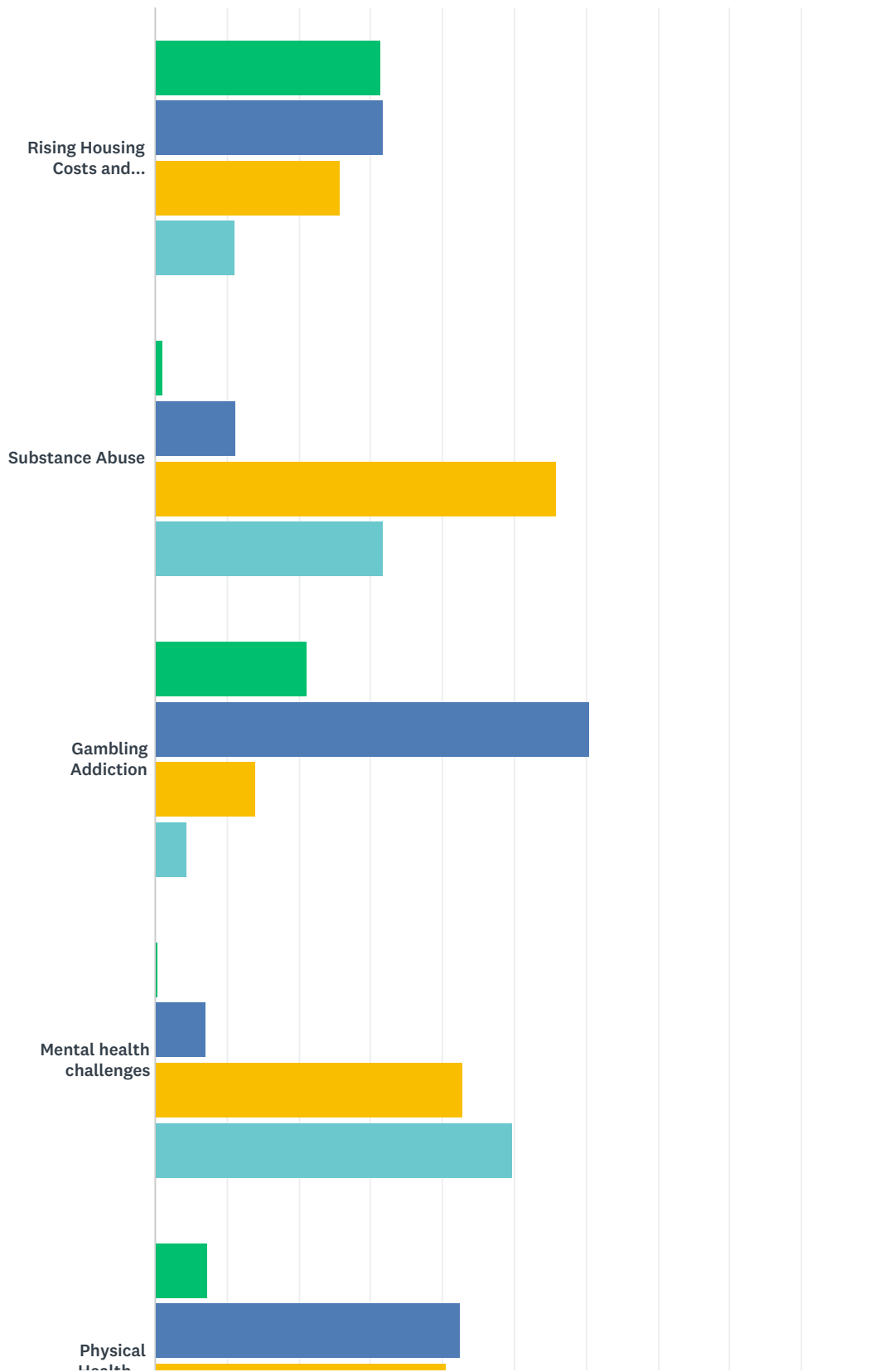

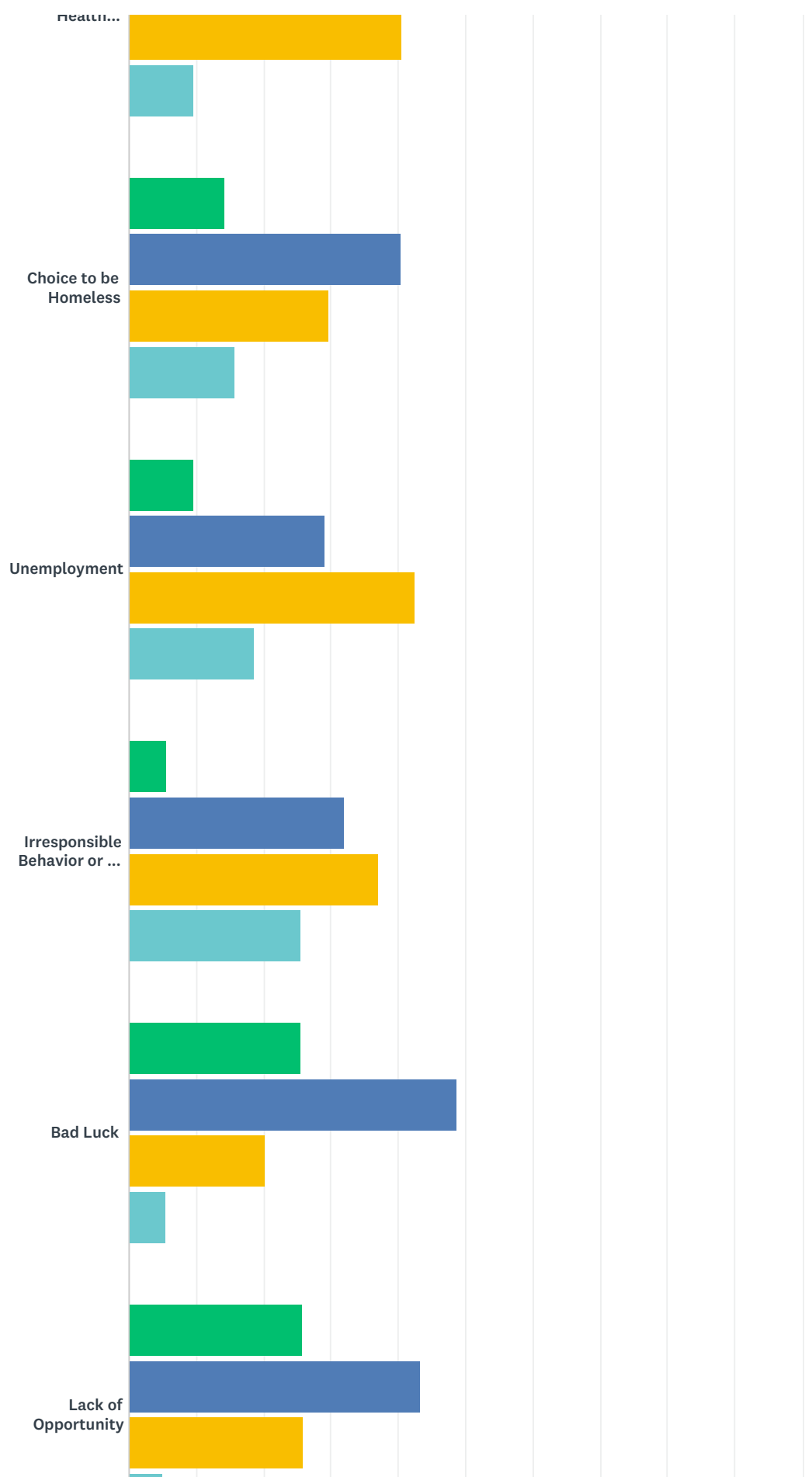

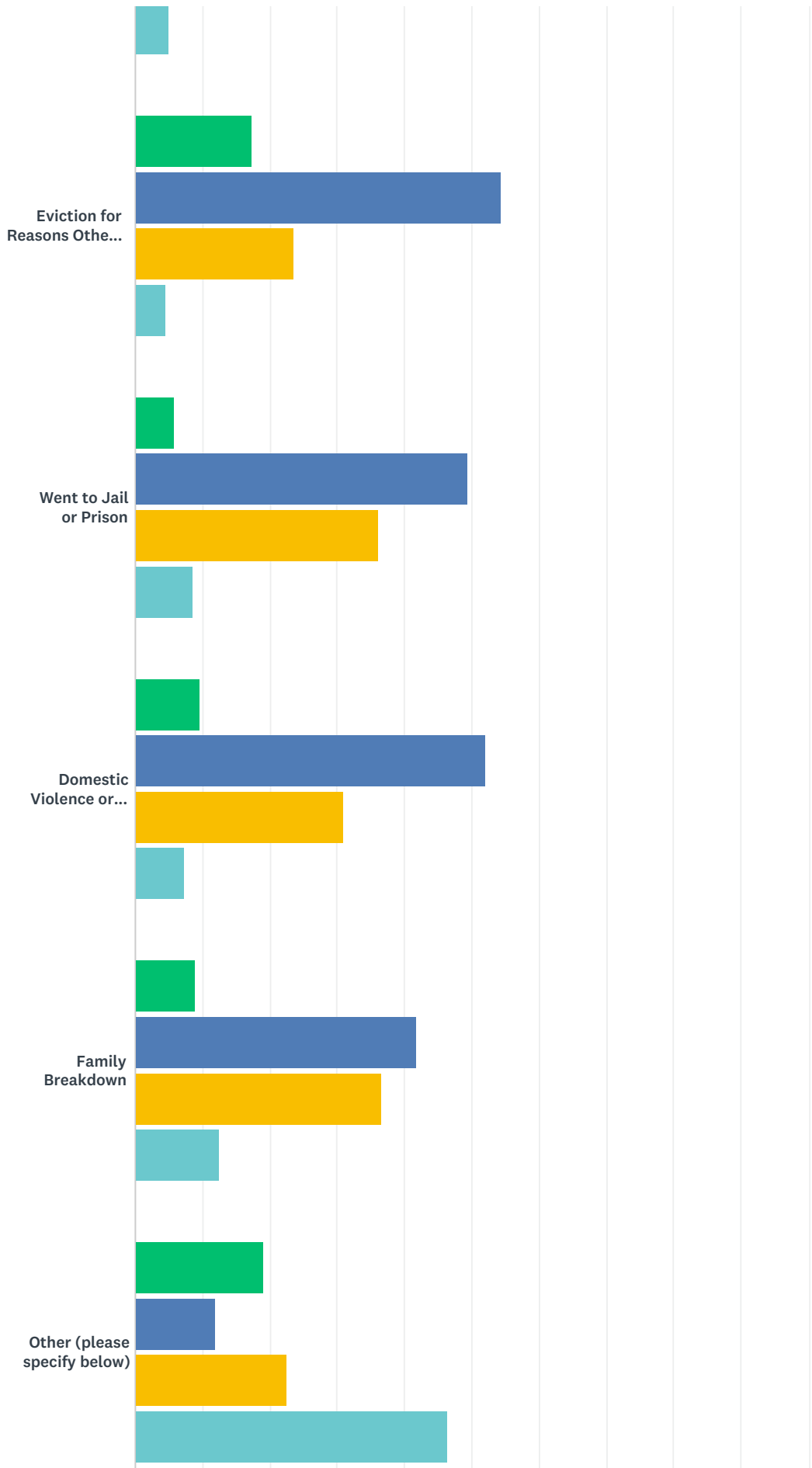

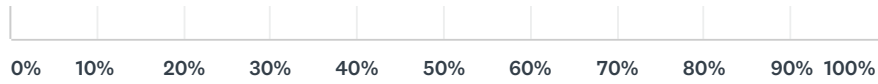

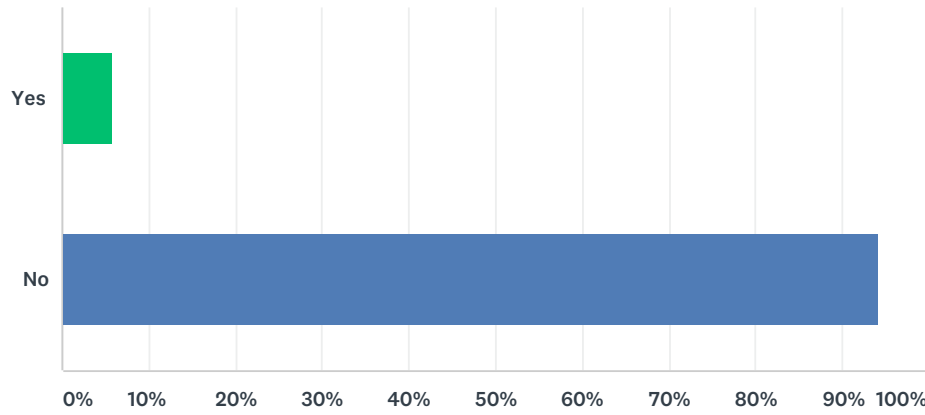

Q9 Have you ever been homeless yourself?

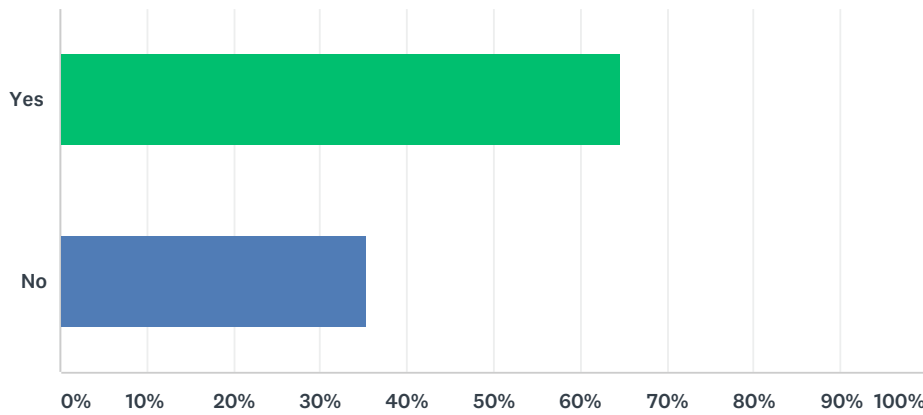

Q10 Have you ever encountered a problem with a homeless person here in Malibu?

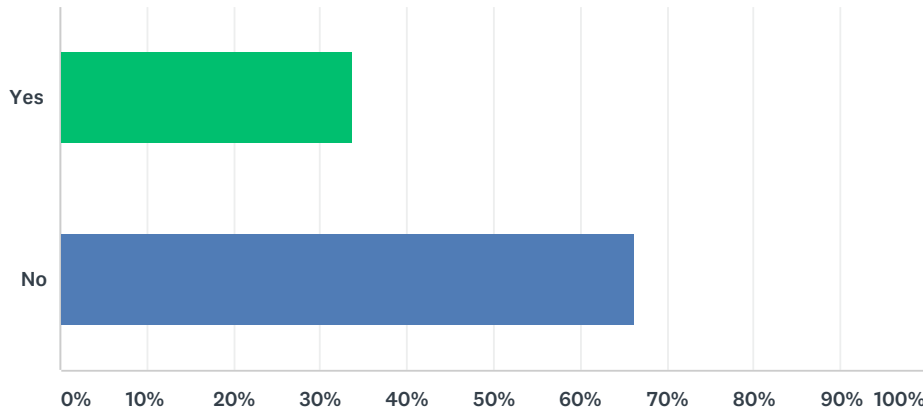

Q11 Do you ever give money to homeless individuals (panhandlers) you encounter in Malibu?

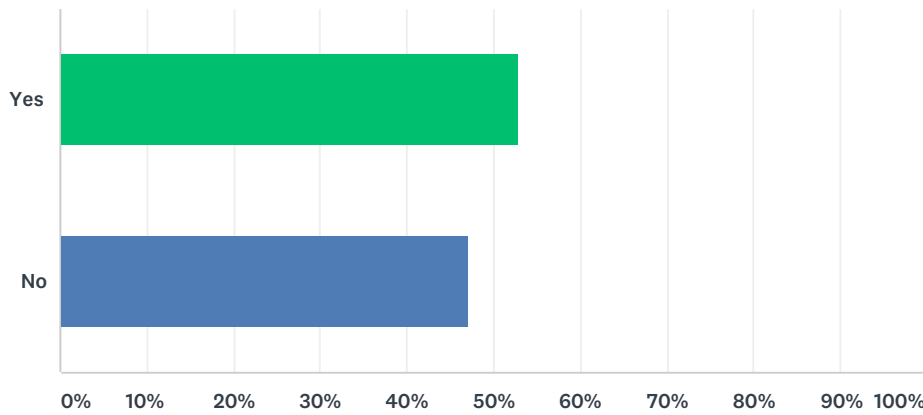

Q12 Have you volunteered at an organization that provides services to the homeless?

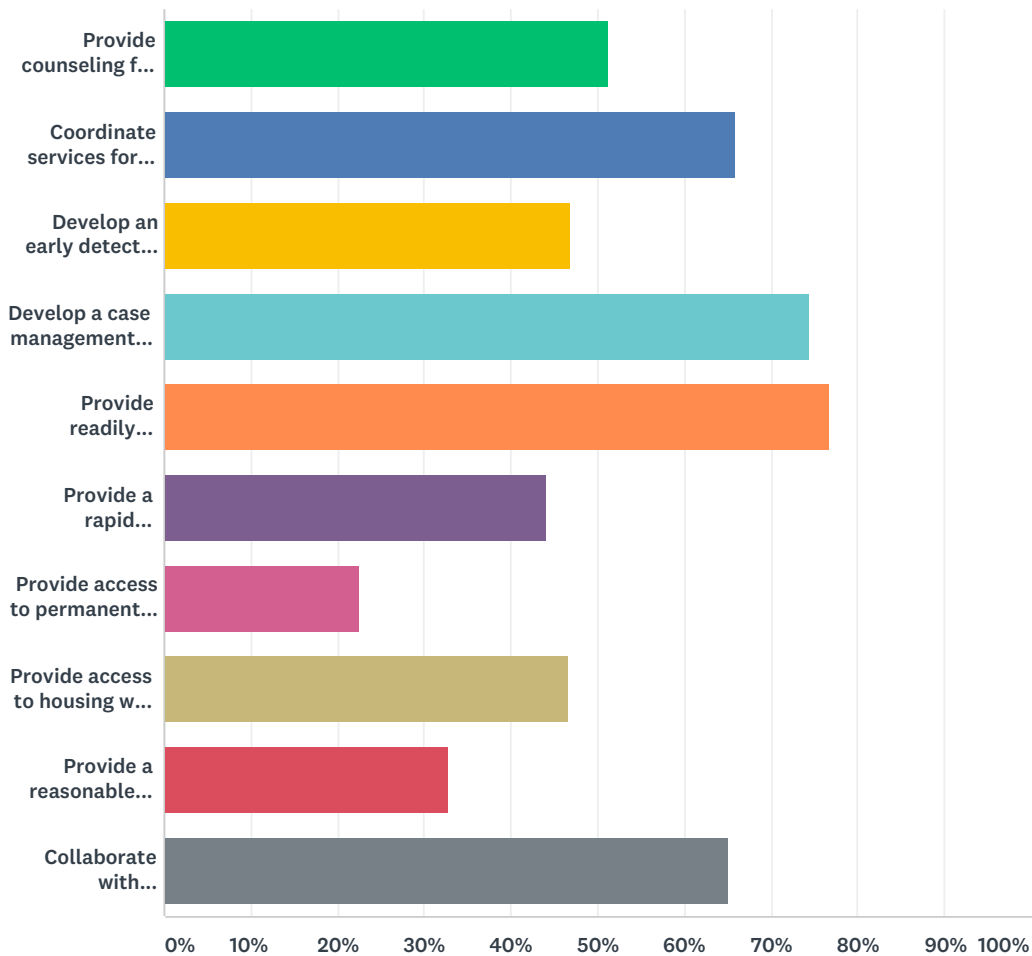

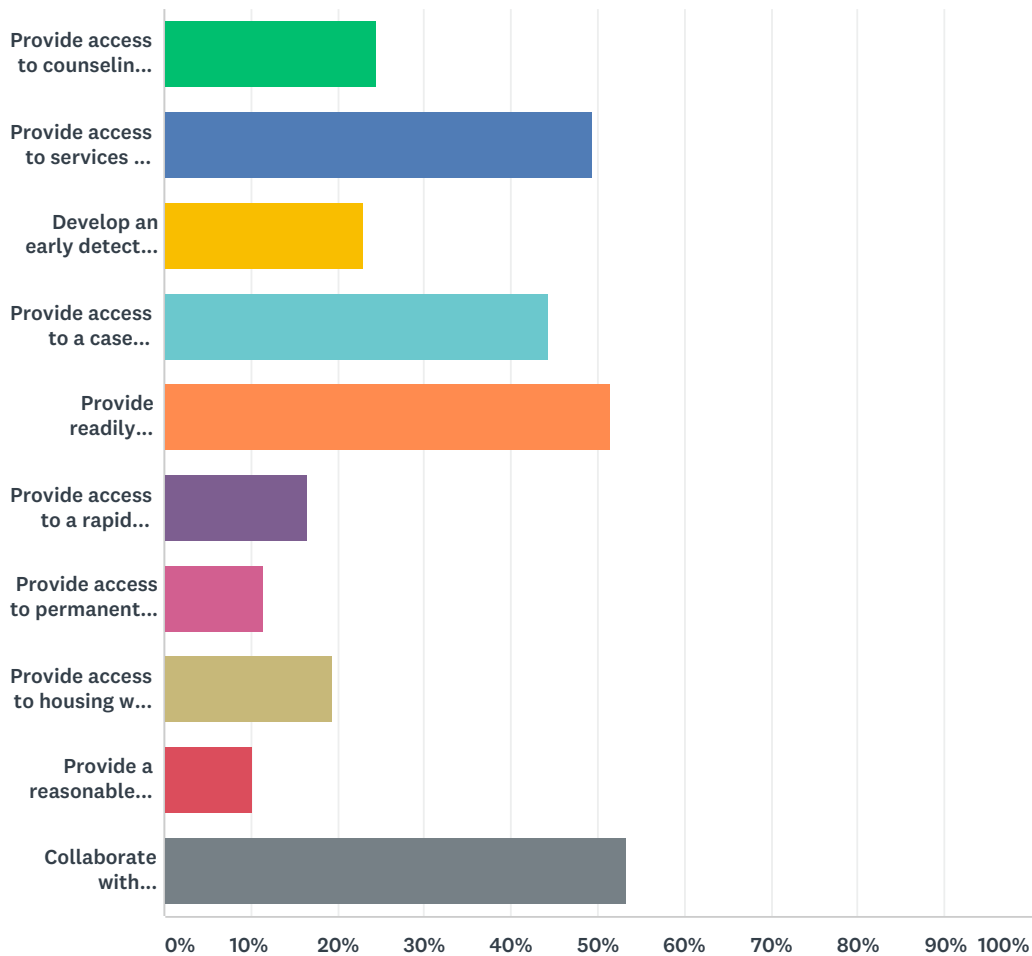

For the first time in all the years I have lived here I too am fearful. I don't feel comfortable walking in any of the shopping centers at night, won't leave my windows open at night, and will no longer go to my office during off-hours. I have had TOO many altercations with violent aggressive people. In a five day stretch I knew 4 people who had homeless break into their homes WHILE they were home. Its crazy...what are we doing? It is not safe! They do not ALL have mental illness. There are many reasons why they are here. Many have been given one way tickets here as Portland, DOWNTOWN etc clean up their areas. They have also been given one way tickets to Hawaii. This is a fact. So now we bus them here and feed them. Why would they leave? Weather is good and they can sit outside of Starbuck and Chipotle and live the life. At the Starbucks (Ralphs shopping center) I have heard them make the crudest sexual comments to very young girls. Disgusting comments. Please understand that I have volunteered and fed the homeless in Santa Monica for years. I have spent plenty of time sitting and talk "life" with them. My heart breaks for so many but this is a HUGE safety concern and I feel that Malibu is not taking it seriously. I know when I was working with the homeless community so many of them said they felt safer on the streets then in shelters...mostly the women which was interesting. I know that many of them had clans that slept in the same areas to protect each other and there was "code" on the street. But for here and now in Malibu, its completely out of control and its taken a nasty turn. We have them in camps in so many areas with tons of trash and a HUUUUUUUGE fire hazard. They are so aggressive and nasty. I have literally seen them crawling over the roof tops in the Colony, Theft has dramatically increased. Break-ins have increased. And I truly feel that nothing has been done. The Powers that be just keep saying how they feel sorry for them and its all mental illness.
