City's Commitment

The City of Malibu wants to incentivize the highest and best use of its resources through waste prevention, source reduction, reuse and recycling.

As stated in the Mission Statement, "Malibu is committed to ensure the physical and biological integrity of its environment through the development of land use programs and decisions, to protect the public and private health, safety and general welfare."

Sustainable Resource Management Laws

The State of California has established goals to reduce greenhouse gas emissions associated with the landfilling of materials.

As a result, all commercial customers (unless approved exempted by the City) are mandated to establish minimum service levels for recycling and food scraps management including food recovery and landfilling. To learn more about exemptions and complete a request, visit MalibuCity.org/Organics.



California Regulation

CalRecycle is the regulatory agency responsible for the oversight of California's landfill reduction goals and greenhouse gas emission targets. This includes, but is not limited to, California Assembly Bills 939, 341, 1826 and Senate Bill 1383, all of which mandate the diversion of organics and recyclables for all generators.

Malibu's Requirements and Policies

Malibu Municipal Code establishes minimum services and program requirement to support the highest and best use of resources and the coastal environment.

Diverting Food Waste and Reducing Green House Gas Emissions

The City's Food Scraps Recycling Program reduces this waste, complies with state laws and minimizes greenhouse gas emissions. Zero Waste Resources

The City provides materials promoting best practices including:

Staff Training

An effective waste reduction plan hinges on the participation and support of employees, managers and customers. Staff training videos and posters are available to provide support. Your hauler will also have specific technical assistance and materials to help your business.

Prevent Waste Food

Reduce surplus food by efficiently buying and storing food. This will help your business save money on disposal and purchasing costs.

Edible Food Donation

Reduce your monthly solid waste and food scrap bill, utilize federal tax deduction opportunities, and be compliant with state laws by donating edible food.


Businesses are encouraged to cut waste, increase recycling and food scraps services, reduce landfill disposal costs, and protect the environment.


