

**SCHOOL ISSUES**

- All schools within Malibu schools are currently on summer break. The last day of school was June 6, 2024. The school will be back in session on August 22, 2024

**INTERVENTIONS**

**COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES**

- The J-Team is in the process of updating all critical information for all LVUSD schools, information that would be important to have during a critical incident at one of our schools.
- The J-Team is in the process of developing a critical incident training scenario for the staff within LVUSD. We are rolling out new and replacing old terminology for critical incidents at our schools (e.g., Active Shooter). The goal of new terminology is to mitigate confusion when handling specific incidents that can occur on campus (e.g., bomb threats, “swatting,” active shooter).
- The J-Team is planning an Active Shooter Scenario event at Lindero Canyon Middle School for Malibu/Lost Hills Sheriff’s Station personnel. In partnership with Malibu Search and Rescue (MSAR), I conducted a walk-through of the middle school to plan scenarios and logistics for the event. We also held several meetings with the logistical personnel to ensure a successful training scenario. The training event would apply to critical incidents across all schools that the station services.
- Troubleshoot “Knox Box” locking mechanisms. Knox Boxes are lock boxes strategically placed at our schools. They contain master keys for the schools, which give law enforcement personnel access to the entire school during a critical incident.
- Referred a juvenile to DYD due to a Malibu grand theft incident. The victims, in this case, did not want to pursue criminal prosecution and requested diversion.
- The J-Team spoke with juveniles at the Boys and Girls Club of Malibu to educate them about the dangers of gateway drugs, narcotics, and addiction.
- The J-Team spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question juvenile concerns and community issues. We also provided the parents with resource programs within our community.
- The J-Team contacted the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney to inquire about the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
- Throughout the month, we met with Captain Jennifer Seetoo to update her on our unit's investigations and current issues involving juveniles in our city.
- The J-Team assisted other investigators in preparing court cases and investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney’s office.

- The J-Team handled the processing and follow-up of various juvenile referrals regarding various juvenile contacts with uniform personnel brought to the attention of this unit.
- The J-Team conducted normal checks of juvenile problem areas in the city during weekend evenings and responded to juvenile-related calls for service.
- The J-Team ensured record sealing procedures were initiated for subjects who completed CHAMPS diversion for minor offenses.
- The J-Team aided in patrolling for CARP, filled in for any patrol shortages, and worked mandatory overtime.
- The J-team conducted “290” Residential Verifications for sex registrants within the city of Malibu.
